Each of these questions must be answered with "yes" if all the safety rules and regulations are being followed. A "no" to whatever question indicates a procedural weakness that might result in damage to machinery, accident or injury.

- 1) Is the forklift operating area separated from pedestrian traffic?
- 2) Is pedestrian access to travel areas of the forklift restricted by barriers?
- 3) The pedestrian walkways well-marked?
- 4) Are "forklift in operation" signs clearly visible?
- 5) Are mirrors for drivers and pedestrians provided at blind spots?
- 6) Changes or alterations to the daily lift truck schedule has been communicated to employees?
- 7) Are lift truck tires suitable for use on all operating surfaces?
- 8) Forklift seatbelt is being utilized?
- 9) The forklift seat is in good condition?
- 10) Is a regular forklift maintenance schedule followed?
- 11) Is an annual forklift certification and inspection carried out?
- 12) Is the forklift right for the needed tasks?
- 13) Does forklift has a readable load chart?
- 14) Could the operators read and understand the load chart?
- 15) Does the chart list the safe capacity for various uses and attachments?
- 16) Are the warning devices on the lift truck working correctly?
- 17) Is the operating speed control device fitted properly?
- 18) The forklift overhead cage is fitted properly?
- 19) Have all forklift operators acquired certification?
- 20) Are speed limits and warning signs being observed?
- 21) Are forklift operators up to date on training for all kinds of lift trucks being used?
- 22) Do operators know their duties to report any machine damage and forklift accidents?
- 23) Is the pre-test checklist reviewed every day prior to the equipment being utilized?
